Our Programs

Infants – The Infant Program is a research-based care and learning environment that support each child’s development. Infant needs are met on demand. It is a period of rapid growth.

Toddlers – Toddlers are learning to discover! The toddler’s curriculum, like the infant’s, is based on play. This is the stage your toddler begins to walk and use words.

Two’s – Socialization is important! Materials in our environment are intentional to support individual child development. Two’s begin responding to their bodily functions.

Three’s – The curriculum content is integrated and includes concepts for all academic areas, while being appropriate for the age and level of development for each child.

Pre-K4 – Getting ready for Kindergarten! The following concepts are covered in our curriculum approach: Language, Math, Science, Social Studies, Art, Health, Music and Movement.

Before and After Care – We provide transportation to local schools. Students receive snacks and homework assistance.

Summer Program – Weekly themes and field trips, STEM projects, guest performers, enrichment activities, and arts and crafts are provided for their enjoyment.
